## **GLOSSARY**

**Music Boosters** - The Music Boosters provide financial and physical support to the music programs of Signal Mountain Middle/High School. They are the life blood of our organization, handling all finances, volunteer work, and organization needed to make our program operate to its best potential.

Concert Band - Signal Mountain Middle offers 3 different concert bands, one in each grade level. During the school day, these bands are divided into the following classes: 6th Grade Brass/Percussion, 6th Grade Woodwind/Percussion, 7th Grade Band, and 8th Grade Band. Each of these bands rehearse mainly during the school day and require only rare after-school rehearsals (other than performances). Our concerts each year include, but are not limited to our "Christmas on the Mountain" concert at the Abba's House in Hixson, Regional Concert Performance Assessment, State Concert Festival (if invited), a Spring Concert held at the school, as well as the traditional Disney World trip taken every other year. Leading up to each of these concerts, 6th grade students are asked to come together during a portion of at least two Directed Studies/Advisory classes to put together the entire ensemble that is normally separated during the school day. Students are asked to take care of homework and other school work prior to these rehearsals, so that we do not require an after-school commitment.

**Pep Band** - This group includes ALL 7th/8th grade band members. Performances include home varsity middle school football games and students perform in the stands for the duration of the game.

**Sectionals** - These are times when instrument-specific classes are held during or after school at different times throughout the year.

**Jazz Band** - Extracurricular ensembles such as Jazz Band practice after school, a minimum of 1 day a week, and operate in late fall (after marching band season), winter, & spring. The Jazz Band will perform a minimum of 1 concert late in the spring semester, as well as possible events outside of school in the Signal Mountain community. Only 7th and 8th grade students are invited to audition for this group.

The importance of rehearsal, attendance & student commitment to make the Jazz Band a successful organization cannot be overstated. If a student is not able to fulfill his/her commitment to the ensemble he/she will not be allowed to participate.

**Chamber Ensemble** - This ensemble is dedicated to grouping small numbers of students together to play a variety of musical genres. They rehearse at least once a week after-school, during advisory/directed studies, or at each other's homes. Playing in small groups is one of the most valuable and rewarding experiences that our students have. I cannot express the importance and value of this group! Their work can be seen at our Spring concert, as well as possible concerts around town. Only 7th and 8th grade students are invited to be a part of these groups.

**Percussion Ensembles** - The 6th, 7th, and 8th grade percussion sections class meet during the school day to learn the fundamentals of their instruments and concert band music, but also work together to play "percussion-only" pieces. The product of their work can be seen at most of our concerts, as well as community events.


**Private Lessons** - These are NOT just for students that are struggling, or are extremely advanced; it is for everyone. While it is not required, we want every student to get the utmost enjoyment out of music, and we, therefore, strongly encourage it. We have the special opportunity of having a great private teacher for every instrument at the Mountain Arts Community Center (MACC) just down the road from the school. Please take the time to consider making a trip there on your way home from school! You can visit their website to find the contact info for each teacher.


**Junior Clinic/All-County** - These are individual opportunities to audition and perform with local and regional Honor Bands! (Open to 7th and 8th grade only)


#### RULES

Classwork Grades -

40% of grade. Earned by having all materials and equipment needed in class, participating in all activities, as well as assignments and quizzes.

Homework Grades -

10% of grade. Take-home assignments and/or recording assignments.

**Test Grades-**

20% of grade. This encompasses all outside events, other than the end-of-term concerts, including Pep band performances, after-school sectionals, festivals, and all other events outside of the classroom.

**End of Term Concerts-**

30% of grade. The largest grade each semester is the end of term concert. This is the "Christmas on the Mountain" concert in December and the Spring Concert in April/May. There are not make-up assignments for these events. Band is a team sport and it is very important that all students are present for concerts.

### "PRACTICE IS FOR HOME, NOT FOR CLASS"

Our band program is very unique with its classroom structure. We learn all of the tools necessary for an individual student to teach himself/herself any given piece of music. We break down each specific concept that comprises music and practice these skills on a daily basis. Therefore, when given a piece of music for a concert, we sometimes expect all students to learn their individual parts on their own. Band is a team sport, and by setting this expectation, our band rehearses "music" every day. It is a unique environment in which we talk about emotion, communication, balance, blend, and so many other elements of musicality. Simply stated, after learning the skills necessary, we no longer learn notes and rhythms in class (that is the students' responsibility); we are then able to be musicians in class.

Students should be bringing their instruments home a couple times a week and especially on the weekends. They should be practicing around 120 minutes per week.

### PAYMENT OF FEES/EXPENSES

**\$40 Requested Band Fee** (checks made payable to "SMMHS Music Boosters and students can put it in the locked Booster box in the band room when school begins. This fee helps cover music, instruments, stands, chairs, buses, concerts, etc. during the school year)

*Instrument cost* (If you are playing a school owned instrument, you will need to pay the yearly price associated with their instrument)

*Cheesecake Sale in October* (not a specific price, but each student needs to do their fair share of work, which is 15 items sold. This is the easiest fundraiser you'll ever do on Signal Mountain, because the community members, teachers, and parents are all waiting for it every year. It's been a tradition since the early 1990s, and the food items we sell are great!)

\$5 per ticket for "Christmas from the Mountain" concert in December
